



TMD/Orofacial Pain Faculty Position

The **Department of Diagnostic and Biological Sciences** in the School of Dentistry at the University of Minnesota seeks applications for a full time, 12 month/per year, tenured/tenure-track faculty position at the level of assistant, associate, or full professor in the **Division of TMD and Orofacial Pain**.

Candidates are expected to have a D.D.S., D.M.D, M.D., Ph.D. and/or equivalent degree, with at least 2 years of postdoctoral training and experience with clinically-based pain management. Candidates with established extramurally funded research programs are preferred. Successful candidates will be expected to have established (tenured) or to develop (tenure-track) strong extramurally funded pain-related clinical research. Salary and start-up funds will be competitive and commensurate with education and experience. Intra-mural clinical practice is available. Candidates must be authorized to work in the United States by the start date.

The School of Dentistry is part of a seven-school Academic Health Center system at the University of Minnesota, one of the most comprehensive academic health centers in the United States. It offers state-of-the art core facilities, with access to the Supercomputing Institute, the Center for Magnetic Resonance Research, and the Clinical and Translational Science Institute, as well as leading basic science and clinical research programs. The campus is located in the Twin Cities, which is a large metropolitan area consistently recognized for its overall quality of life.
